12. 2025 P3 Gifted Education Programme (GEP) Exercise (information from GEP Branch)

The tentative schedule for the GEP Screening Exercise is on 21 August 2025. P3 students shortlisted after the GEP Screening Exercise will attend the GEP Selection Exercise tentatively on 14 and 15 October 2025. The GEP Screening and Selection Exercise will be based on the Primary 1 to Primary 3 English Language and Mathematics Syllabuses.

12. Closing of Art and Environment CCA in 2025

After careful and extensive deliberation, the school has made the difficult decision to close the Art Club and Environment Club CCA due to resource limitations. We would like to inform you of the following:

- 1. Affected students and parents were notified of this closure in November 2024.
- 2. To ensure a smooth transition, these students have until the end of January 2025 to explore and try out other CCAs that align with their interests.
- 3. Students will then be able to make their choice of a new CCA based on these experiences.
- We want to assure you that art experiences will continue to be an integral part of our art lessons, ensuring students still have opportunities to develop their artistic skills and creativity.
- 5. Similarly, environmental education and activities will be incorporated into our science lessons, allowing students to continue engaging with environmental issues and sustainability practices.

We sincerely appreciate the understanding of parents and students regarding this impending closure. We are committed to supporting all affected students in finding new CCAs that nurture their talents and passions, while ensuring that art and environmental education remain key components of our curriculum.

13. School Fees

 - a) The respective Form Teachers b) The SCC Supervisor

This ensures that all relevant staff are aware of any changes to your child's usual routine, maintaining their safety and proper care.

15. Road Safety and Orderliness

The traffic flow is very busy at the start and end of the school day. We appreciate all parents being gracious and patient, waiting in line and following our ground staff's coordination for the safety of our students and staff.

Start of School Day:

- Parents driving to school to drop off children in the mornings, please remain in your vehicles.
- Move off once your children have alighted.

End of School Day:

 Parents waiting to fetch children home during peak hours are strongly advised to park at nearby HDB car parks.

Dismissal Arrangements:

- 1. Gate 3: For dismissal of P1, P2 and P3 students
 - Only parents of P1, P2, P3 students will be allowed into the limited Parents' Waiting Area.
 - Please do not bring pets into the parents' waiting area.
- 2. Gate 2: For dismissal of all other students

We kindly remind all parents and guardians that these measures are in place to ensure the safety and smooth flow of traffic around our school. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

16. Safe Management Measures for Visitors
